


It is only when Proverbs 6: 20 - 22 becomes the reality in our lives, that we can have the blessings of 6:23.



conformity to worldly customs and influences that they seem to have lost all power to discriminate between light and darkness, truth and error...



The lamp is enough of light for one room. The light is enough of light for the entire planet.



It is not natural for human beings to cherish the law of God. According to Ellen G. White, it is only at the foot of the cross that things change. And this lifelong process is the work of the Spirit writing God's law in the heart of believers.

"The light shining from the cross reveals the love of God. His love is drawing us to Himself. If we do not resist this drawing, we shall be led to the foot of the cross in repentance for the sins that have crucified the Saviour. Then the Spirit of God through faith produces a new life in the soul. The thoughts and desires are brought into obedience to the will of Christ. The heart, the mind, are created anew in the image of Him who works in us to subdue all things to Himself. Then the law of God is written in the mind and heart, and we can say with Christ, "I delight to do Thy will, O my God." Psalm 40:8.


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V. Conclusion
