




I. Introduction

The first collection of poems in chapter 14 (1-7) starts with the wise woman and concludes with the foolish man. In addition, there is a parallel between the perverse man and the scoffer. The wordplay is obvious in Hebrew: LUWZ for 'perverse' and LUWTS for 'mocker'.



The center of the poem is helping the reader to remember the blessing of God to Jacob, one of the patriarchs who for seven years of his service to Laban, despite of the abusive treatment of his relative, became rich.

There is always a reason for prosperity.

"In this way the man grew exceedingly prosperous and came to own large flocks, and maidservants and menservants, and camels and donkeys." Genesis 30: 43

The most important reason is God's action in our favor.



Proverbs 14 is also a reminder of the blessings mentioned at the end of Torah, the 5 books of Moses:

"Blessed shall be the fruit of your body, the produce of your ground and the increase of your herds, the increase of your cattle and the offspring of your flocks." Deuteronomy 28: 4

In the first poem of chapter 14 (1-7), the author describes a woman building her house (cf. Psalm 127). In the second poem (v. 8-14) the house (BEITH in Hebrew) is the center of all.

The wicked man can apparently be prosperous and have a house, but without blessings. It is possible that the upright man have only a tent. Nevertheless everything that he has or does will be prosperous.




Our verse (14: 12) can be understood as an echo to the verse about the disrespect of those who are fools and don't care to choose the right way of living (14: 9). They don't care about sin. They consider that everything is allowed, having the philosophy of life summarized in the following statement "WHY NOT?"


1. The religious experience as a way of life




