

II. Context



On His road to Jerusalem, (Section #5 of the Gospel of Luke), after His own prayer, the disciples of Jesus requested Him to teach them how to pray. In chapter 11: 1 - 13, He presented His teaching in a powerful way, encouraging His followers to cultivate a regular prayer time, as well as to send requests to our heavenly Father with the certitude of receiving answers.

22: 1 - 23: 56 Jesus' Passion, Death, and Burial

24: 1 – 24: 53 Jesus' Resurrection, Post-resurrection Teaching, and Ascension




