

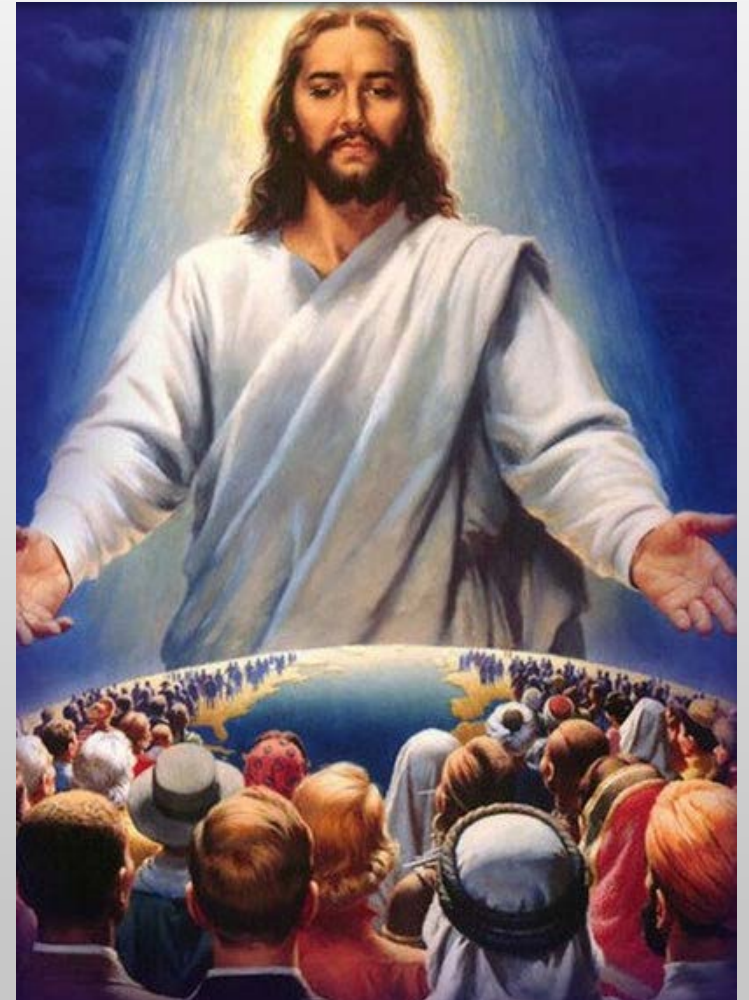
# Must the Whole World Hear?

# I. Introduction

The entire world should hear the Good News of God's kingdom. God invites all inhabitants without excluding anybody. This is why we share His message of love with everyone, showing to all inhabitants of the earth the incommensurable riches of God's grace.

The idea that Gentiles should be on exactly the same plane as Israelites and, furthermore, in the intimate relationship as being members of the same body, is absolutely foreign to the Old Testament. “A Hollywood film was made about him called The Terminal starring Tom Hanks. Finally the wonderful day came when France gave him citizenship and a passport and he could leave the prison of the airport to live in Paris and come and go as he pleased. Before the cross of Christ, mankind was divided into two groups: Jews and Gentiles. The Old and New Testaments both make very clear what caused this distinction. It was the covenant God had made with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and with their descendants through Moses. This covenant made God's "chosen people" absolutely unique. After the Cross a new entity came into existence – the church that Jesus Christ promised He would build (Mt 16:18). Essential also is an understanding that the church was created through offering to both Jews and Gentiles a "new covenant" relationship with God. Paul explains that Gentiles who were "aliens ...of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise" have been "made nigh [to God] by the blood of Christ" (Eph:2:13). God has "broken down the middle wall of partition between [Jew and Gentile]; having abolished in his flesh the [Mosaic] law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain [Jew and Gentile] one new man" (Eph:2:11-22) Dave Hunt.

“Condemnation comes to everyone who does evil, to Jew first and also to the Gentiles. (Romans 2:9). But the salvation also comes through Jesus Christ to everyone who accepts Him as Saviour, to Jew first and also to the Gentiles (2:11). The Old Testament spent a lot of time to prepare Israel to accomplish the mission of the ‘chosen people’. (Ex. 19). The New Testament considers all those who follow Jesus as ‘special people’, proclaiming the praises of Him who called all nations “out of darkness into His marvelous light.” (1 Peter 2: 9).

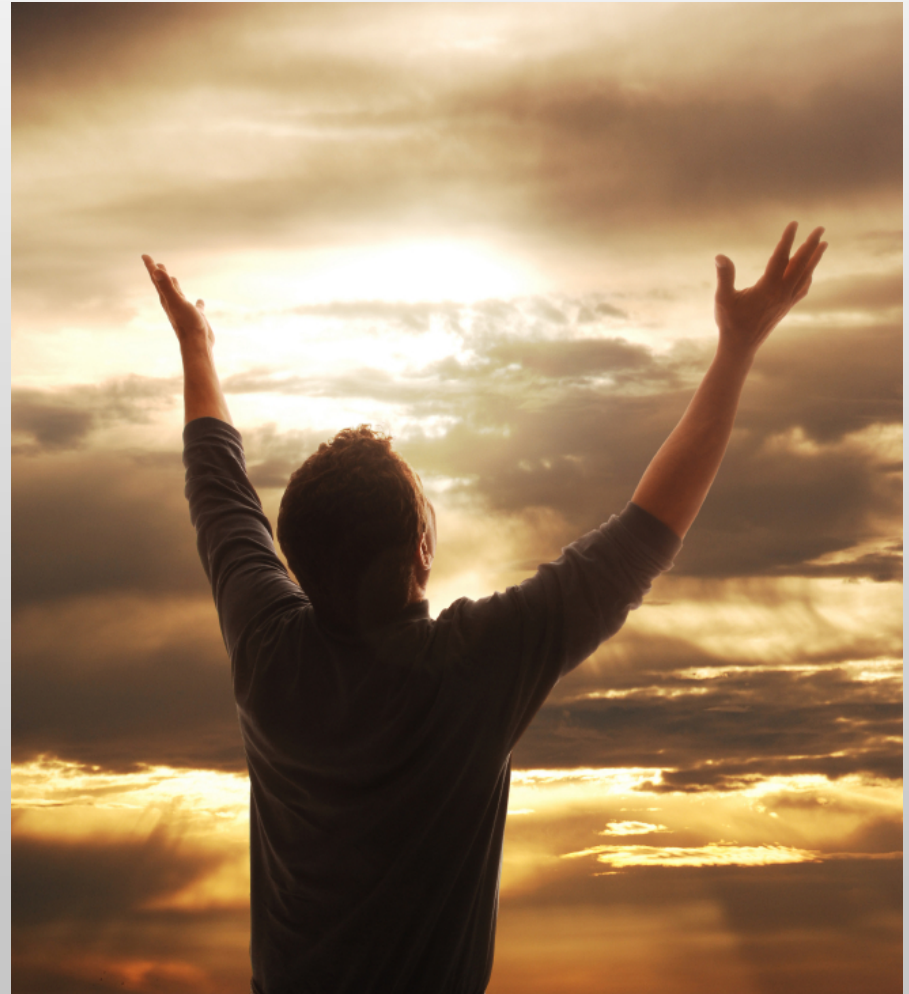
## 2. The apostle Paul appropriates the Gospel “According to my gospel”

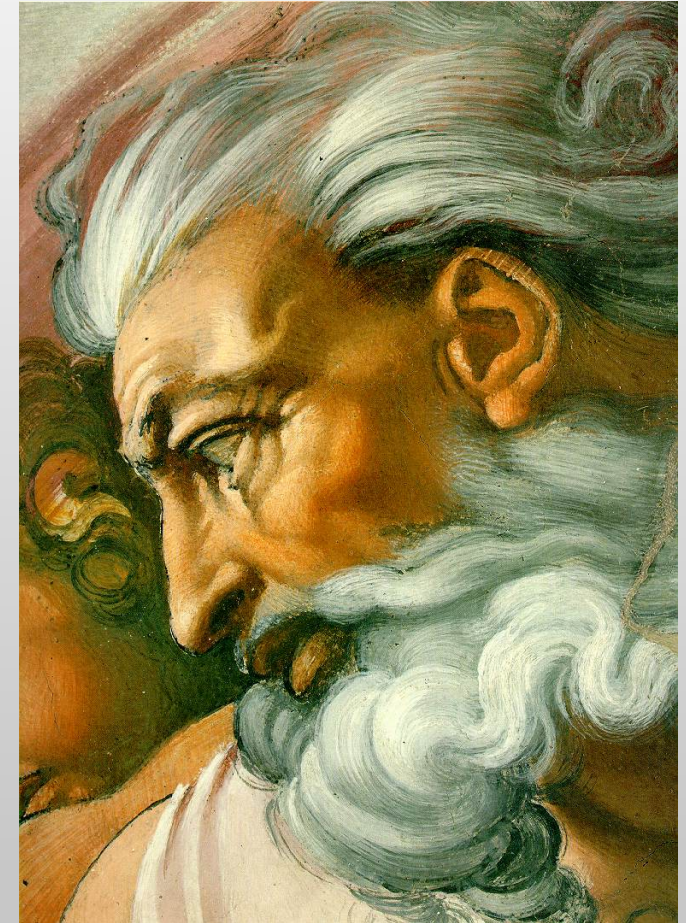

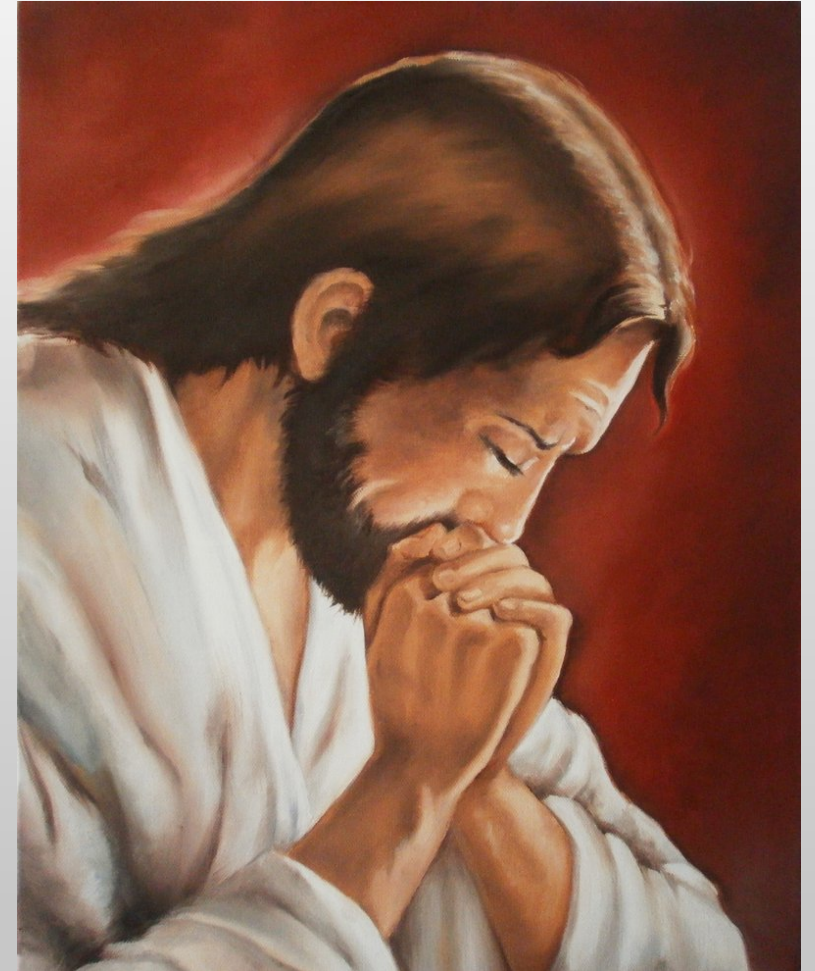
