II. Context



Christ's message to seven churches confirms that He cares for those who are experiencing challenging situations during the Great Controversy between Good and Evil.



Smyrna and Philadelphia didn't receive a message of critics or a call to repentance. For them, Christ was the First and the Last. Under His leadership their victory was attainable.

2. Jesus is always offering the full liberty "And knock".



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"Jesus Christ appeals to the sinner not only with His hand (His providences) knocking, but with His voice (His word read or heard; or rather, His Spirit inwardly applying to man's spirit the lessons to be drawn from His providence and His word). If we refuse to answer to His knocking at our door now, He will refuse to hear our knocking at His door hereafter. In respect to His second coming also, He is even now at the door, and we know not how soon He may knock: therefore we should always be ready to open to Him immediately." 

"Our Redeemer sends His messengers to bear a testimony to His people. He says: "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me." Revelation 3:20. But many refuse to receive Him. The Holy Spirit waits to soften and subdue hearts; but they are not willing to open the door and let the Saviour in, for fear that He will require something of them. 5. Jesus is longing for an *intimate* **relationship** with us "I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me"





"Christ's offer to dine with the repentant church speaks of fellowship, communion, and intimacy. Sharing a meal in ancient times symbolized the union of the people in loving fellowship. Believers will dine with Christ at the marriage supper of the Lamb (19:9), and in the millennial kingdom (Luke 22:16, 29-30). Dine is from DEIPNEO, which refers to the evening meal, the last meal of the day (cf. Luke 7:8; 22:20; 1 Cor. 11:25, where the underlying Greek is rendered. The Lord Jesus Christ urged them to repent and have fellowship with Him before the night of judgment fell and it was too late forever." John MacArthur, MacArthur New Testament Commentary: Revelation


V. Conclusion

The heart becomes less impressible, and lapses into a perilous unconsciousness of the shortness of life, and of the great eternity beyond. Our condemnation in the judgment will not result from the fact that we have been in error, but from the fact that we have neglected heaven-sent opportunities for learning what is truth."


