



II. Context



Our text about the call of the disciples by Jesus is preceding the first major teaching in the book of Matthew (Sermon of the Mountain). Its structure is built around the essential message of Jesus: Repentance as the best preparation for God's kingdom

Four disciples called by Jesus in this chapter were fishermen. Jesus uses their skills and experience in order to make them effective for the accomplishment of their ministry: from fishermen they became fishers of men.



At the end of our text, and before His major speech, Jesus is followed by a great multitude. The impact of His ministry went well beyond Galilee. At that time, He was not only considered as a local teacher (rabbi). Everybody was able to see the impact of God's wonderful work among human beings.



III. Jesus gives meaning to our life. By following Him, His power is transforming us in His likeness. This is how we achieve the maximum of our potential.








The follower of Jesus has a triple challenge:


"None of us should be like the fisherman who thinks he has been fishing all day when in reality he has spent most of his time getting to and from the water, eating lunch, and fussing with his equipment. Fishing success is related to how long you have your line in the water, not to how long you are away from the apartment. Some fishermen are away from home for twelve hours and have their line in the water for ten hours. Other fishermen are away from home for twelve hours and have their line in the water for only two hours. This last type may wonder why they do not have the same success as others. The same principle applies to missionaries, whom the Master called 'fishers of men.' A missionary's line should drop into the fishing water the moment he or she leaves the apartment."

3. Jesus will teach us how to deal with human beings better than anyone else. He is our Creator "I will make you Fishers of Men."



You will not grow into fishers by yourselves, but this is what Jesus will do for you if you will just follow him.

A young man asked, "What is the best way to become an effective preacher?" One person answers, "Go to seminary." "But Christ says, "Young man, follow me, and I will make you a fisher of men." How is a person to be useful? "Attend a training-class," one says. That's true, but there is a much better answer than that—"Follow Jesus, and he will make you fishers of men."

To the unlearned, toiling fishermen of Galilee was the call addressed: "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." Matthew 4:19. These disciples were humble and teachable. The less they had been influenced by the false teaching of their time, the more successfully could Christ instruct and train them for His service. So in the days of the Great Reformation. The leading Reformers were men from humble life—men who were most free of any of their time from pride of rank and from the influence of bigotry and priestcraft. It is God's plan to employ humble instruments to accomplish great results. Then the glory will not be given to men, but to Him who works through them to will and to do of His own good pleasure."

"Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men," He offered no stated sum as a reward for their services. They were to share with Him His self-denial and sacrifice.

Those who claim to be followers of the Master Worker, and who engage in His service as co-laborers with God, are to bring into their work the exactitude and skill, the tact and wisdom, that the God of perfection required in the building of the earthly tabernacle. And now, as in that time and as in the days of Christ's earthly ministry, devotion to God and a spirit of sacrifice should be regarded as the first requisites of acceptable service. God designs that not one thread of selfishness shall be woven into His work."

V. Conclusion



"It is harder to reach the hearts of men today than it was twenty years ago. The most convincing arguments may be presented to sustain the truth, and yet sinners seem as far from repentance and conversion as ever. The work of saving souls is no child's play. It requires earnest, untiring labor to wrench the prey of Satan from his grasp. But God will sustain his servants in the work which he has himself committed to their hands. Said Christ to the first disciples, as they toiled upon the sea of Galilee, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." When the gospel net is cast, let there be a watching by the net, with tears and earnest prayer. Let the workers determine not to become discouraged; and not to let go the net until it is drawn ashore, with the fruit of their labor. Sometimes, indeed, we may say with Peter, "We have toiled all the night and have taken nothing," but still it is the Master's command, as of old, "Let down the net on the right side of the ship,"— work on in faith, and God will give success."
