


I. Introduction: GOD AS SOURCE OF PEACE AND **REST**

Human beings cannot provide rest. Only God can.







II. Context



The structure of Matthew 11: 28 – 30 is Christ centered. He is in the middle of the text. We can learn from Him because of the virtues of His character (gentle and lowly in heart).



Matthew 11: 28 – 30 Structure

Come to me, all you who labor and have heavy burdens 28a B And I will give you rest. 28b Take my yoke upon you 29a And learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart 29b And you will find rest for your souls. B' 29c For my yoke is easy 30a And my burden is light 30b

By coming to Jesus we receive rest and an easy yoke. The yoke is easy because it is His own. Everything coming from God's hand has meaning and represents expression of His love.

III. To live in God's presence is the essential element of a meaningful life and, as consequence, is providing peace and rest.



1. The rest can be found only if we find God "Come to Me"

"All you who are weary"




