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
I. Introduction:The Importance of theCornerstone

A cornerstone is essential for the construction of a building. In parallel, the crucial element for building the Church is Jesus Christ. There is no church without Him.





After all, a foundation is not something that can be rebuilt during every phase of construction. 

The center of the chapter 21 in the Gospel of Matthew is about the questioning of Jesus' authority by the religious leaders. Instead of trying to understand His ministry, they wanted to impose to Him their own vision of leadership: having everything under control. Jesus refused to comply and very soon the religious leaders were trying to eliminate Jesus. Immanuel, God with us, was not well received among His own.



Jesus Christ and Religious Leaders



III. Through Jesus Christ God was able to show His everlasting love and to build His community of believers, as a sign to the entire universe of His wisdom and glory.






3. Jesus is the chief cornerstone for the construction of the church

V. Conclusion


